

International students must show that adequate money is available to support the student while in the United States by completing the following:

1. Submit a certified bank letter showing a sufficient amount in an account to cover tuition, fees, housing, health insurance, books, supplies, and other miscellaneous expenses.
2. Bank statement in the applicant's or sponsor's name.
3. A scholarship award letter from a foundation, agency or government.
4. A letter from an individual sponsor indicating the intention to provide support for the specified amount and which is accompanied by a bank statement showing the ability to do so.

Financial support documents described above must not be more than 90 days old.

\*Health Insurance Fee: This fee applies only to students who have been billed for health insurance for fall 2008. The premium is \$840 for coverage from September 1, 2008 through August 31, 2009. Otherwise, you are required to pay this fee.
